Issue:

Westminster Annexation No. 66 - Crowell Property

Background:

The City of Westminster is currently processing annexation request No. 66 - Crowell property. This annexation area consists of two properties owned by Robert A. Crowell totaling 0.3548 acre This property is located on the northern side of Sullivan Avenue, west of the intersection with Pennsylvania Avenue. The property to be annexed is contiguous to the boundary line of the existing corporate limits for the City of Westminster. The annexation area is in the County's **R-7,500 Zoning District** and has a land use designation of "**Urban Residential.**" in both the *City of Westminster 2009 Comprehensive Plan (Located within the plan on the Annexable Land with Development Potential map)* and the 2007 Westminster Environs Community Comprehensive Plan. The Town has indicated its intent to place the annexation area in the **R-7,500 Zoning District**. The change in the zoning districts will not increase the density by more than 50%, so a zoning waiver is not required.

A full staff report was presented to the Planning and Zoning Commission on January 17, 2017. Following their review, the Planning and Zoning Commission is forwarding this report to the Board of County Commissioners for their review and concurrence. A comment letter with the Board's signatures will be sent to the City.

ISSUE:

Amendments to the Carroll County Code of Public Local Laws and Ordinances Chapter 36 "Personnel Policies".

BACKGROUND:

On January 19, 2017, the Board of County Commissioners convened a Public Hearing accepting testimony on proposed amendments to the Carroll County Code of Public Laws and Ordinances Chapter 36 "Personnel Policies". The Personnel Code and the amendments are intended to assure the fair and equal treatment of County employees with regard to certain aspects of their employment.

The Board of Commissioners received a briefing on the nature of the proposed amendments and outline of the reasons for the suggested changes on October 6 and 20, and December 15, 2016. The four substantive changes presented to the Board were:

- 1. an increase in the amount of compensatory time employees are eligible to maintain,
- 2. the elimination of encumbered leave and advanced sick leave which have been largely superseded and replaced by the Short Term Disability Benefit Policy 17-91-HR and the Catastrophic/Extended Family Sick Leave Policy 2014-HR-07,
- 3. limiting leave without pay absences to no more than 30 days in a rolling 12 month period, and
- 4. clarifying holiday leave process for employees required to work on a Commissioner determined holiday.
- 5. clarifying holiday leave accrual for those employees working non-standard schedules
 - a. hired and working in a non-standard work schedule prior to March 1, 2017
 - b. hired and working in a non-standard work schedule on or after March 1, 2017

During the public hearing five (5) employees offered comment on the holiday leave calculation that is specified in Chapter 36 "Personnel Policies". On January 26, 2017 the Board of Commissioners requested staff to provide a briefing on the various methods of awarding holiday leave and the implications of each method to county operations. On February 9, 2017 the Board of Commissioners requested staff to revise proposed language for Chapter 36 Section 36.086 Holiday Leave.

Briefing, Discussion & Decision February 16, 2017

Issue: Northern Recycling & Waste Transfer Contract Renewals

Background: Through Carroll County's membership in the Northeast Maryland

Waste Disposal Authority (Authority), separate contracts exist on the

County's behalf for the Transfer of Wastes and Recyclable

Materials.

The agreement for recycling with Recycle America and the agreement for waste with Advanced Disposal are on an annual

renewal basis for the fiscal year.

In the March 29, 2016, Open Session, we discussed the Authority performing a procurement to combine both services in an attempt to obtain better contract pricing for recycling. The RFP process started

last fall; Best and Final Offers were received in January 2017.

Based on analysis of those results, better pricing for that service was

not achieved. Advisement is to cancel that procurement.

Desired Action: Decision to authorize renewal of the contracts for an additional year

and cancel procurement for combined services.
