Possible Decision: Consideration of Bond Resolution

Background:

The County is in the process of issuing bonds to acquire the funding necessary to pay for the costs of various previously appropriated capital projects. The attached list indicates the projects being funded in this bond issue. As part of this process, the Board must adopt a resolution which formally authorizes the issuance of the bonds.

This resolution authorizes the issuance of general obligation County Commissioners of Carroll County Consolidated Public Improvement Bonds of 2016 in the maximum aggregate principal amount of approximately \$14.0 million to finance a portion of the costs of the design, acquisition, engineering, construction and equipping of certain public works, public schools, public safety, general government, conservation projects, and fire company loans. Approximately \$4.0 million of this bond issue represents reimbursement of costs already paid on projects at or near completion.

In addition, the resolution may authorize the issuance of additional bonds to refund outstanding maturities of prior bond issues producing present value savings in debt service over the next several years. The refunding bonds will only be issued if the market prices on the date of sale produce savings; there is not an obligation to issue the refunding bonds.

The bond sale will be advertised on October 31st and November 4^h with the on-line sale scheduled for November 10, 2016, and settlement scheduled for November 22, 2016.

Mr. David Gregory from McKennon Shelton & Henn, LLP, County's bond counsel, will be here to present the proposed bond resolution and answer any questions.

Department of Planning Briefing Paper October 20, 2016 Open Session

Issue:

Action on the part of the Board is required in order for the Johnsville Road sidewalk project to proceed to design phase.

Background:

The Department of Planning has been working on a project that, when completed, will connect Eldersburg Elementary and Liberty High School via a constructed sidewalk along Johnsville Road. The Department has been pursuing funding for this project through the Safe Routes to School (SRTS) program. SRTS is a federally-funded effort to encourage children to safely walk or bicycle to school. The program is administered by the Maryland State Highway Administration and provides 80 percent funding for projects that promote safe, alternative transportation options. Funds can be used for infrastructure improvements, such as upgrades to crosswalks, traffic signals, sidewalks and signage around schools, as well as for non-infrastructural projects for educational and enforcement efforts.

Identified in the County CIP, this project provides planned funding for construction of a new sidewalk that will begin at the Victor Drive crosswalk and proceed along the east side of Johnsville Road for approximately 800 feet to Bartholow Road. The sidewalk portion of the project is anticipated to be located entirely within the County-owned right-of-way of Johnsville Road. Future phases of this project are conditioned upon the execution of a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the County and SHA.

As this project proceeded through the planning phases a problem involving stormwater drainage was identified. Following examination, it was determined that the most cost-effective means for addressing this challenge would be to direct flows to an existing stormwater management facility located on the grounds of Liberty High School. Use of this facility requires the permission of the Carroll County Board of Education (BOE).

Staff has been working with the BOE to draft and sign a MOU granting access and authorizing construction activities to facilitate the discharge of additional Stormwater to the existing facility at Liberty High School as part of the overall sidewalk construction efforts. Once this MOU is executed, it will be forwarded to the Maryland State Highway Administration as part of the draft MOU between the County and SHA for this infrastructure project. Once both MOUs are executed, the County can initiate the design phase for this segment of sidewalk. This matter has been scheduled for deliberations at the Board's October 27 session.

Public Works Unallocated (9902) to White Rock Road over Piney Run (8385)

Background:

The Department of Public Works (DPW) reviewed the bids that were opened on September 14, 2016. The lowest responsive bid is \$980,579.00. This is the second advertisement and bid of the project.

The first advertisement and bid was conducted in April 2016. One bid, in the amount of \$1,426,477.25, was received. DPW, upon consultation with the MD State Highway Administration, decided to not accept the bid and revise the contract documents. The difference in the bids is \$445,898.25; a savings in local funding of \$89,179.65.

The difference between the adopted budget and the actual/projected costs is shown below.

This is a difference of \$278,269.81. Since this is a federal aid project, local funds are needed to cover 20-percent of the costs.

Based on the current figures, a budget transfer in the amount of \$50,000 from Public Works Unallocated to White Rock Road over Piney Run is being requested by the Department of Public Works.

Summary: The Carroll County Sheriff's Office's Domestic Violence (DV) Unit is staffed by two full-time Deputies and two full-time Domestic Violence Facilitators. The Domestic Violence Facilitators log orders, enter data into national and state computer systems, perform criminal background checks, interview victims, conduct gun checks and perform lethality screenings. The Deputies in the DV Unit serve orders, seize firearms, provide evidence to the DV Prosecutor, perform safety checks and contact victims.

In FY 2015, the unit served 1,444 Interim, Temporary, Final and Show Cause Protective and Peace Orders. With the support of the grant funded position, the DV Unit insures that 98% of the orders are entered within 24 hours.

The grant will partially fund the salary of the Domestic Violence Facilitator #1. The County match for this grant is provided by the remainder of the salary and benefits of the Domestic Violence Facilitator #1 and salary and benefits of the DV Facilitator #2 (a county position).

Background: Human Services Programs of Carroll County, Inc. (HSP) currently runs multiple shelters in the county, including the Cold Weather Shelter. There are holidays when County and library facilities are closed, but temperatures and/or weather events pose dangerous conditions for the county's most vulnerable citizens.

Program; HSP is proposing that Day Time Warming / Cooling Centers open at Westminster Senior Center on holidays, when County and library facilities are closed. The warming center hours will run from 7:30 am - 7:30 pm. The cooling center would run only during the hottest parts of the day, 10:00 am - 3:00 pm.

Warming Center Dates:

- Christmas Day Sunday 12/25/2016
- Christmas Day Observed Monday 12/26/2016

The decision to open the Warming or Cooling Centers on these holidays will be based upon weather predictions. The Extreme Temperature Relief Center Plan would be enacted at the discretion of the Maryland Department of Health and Mental Hygiene (DHMH), or the Carroll County health officer, Director of Citizen Services or designee, Human Service Program Executive Director or designee and the Emergency Management coordinator cooperatively.

Budget: A proposed daily rate has been established to include staffing/administration, food, and activities for the participants of the services. Reimbursement to HSP will only be made if the decision to extend the hours has been agreed upon by all parties noted above.

Background: The Department of Citizen Services applies each year for ESG funds to support the emergency shelter services and housing programs operated by HSP. This competitive grant is funded through a combination of Federal and State funds.

Emergency Shelter

This award provides funding for two of HSP's emergency shelters. With 20 beds, the Intact Family Shelter is the only shelter in the County for intact families or single dads with their children. With 23 beds the Women's Shelter serves single women and women with their children. Last fiscal year these two shelters served 174 unduplicated clients including 76 children. Of those that left Women and Children's shelter, 52% moved to permanent housing and 35% moved to transitional housing. Of those that left Intact Family shelter, 63% moved to permanent housing and 34% moved to transitional housing.

Rapid Rehousing (RRH)

This award provides funding for HSP's rapid rehousing program for families with children. This program provides rental assistance of up to \$500 for up to 6 months with families contributing 30% of their income toward rent. In FY 15, the program housed 28 clients including 14 children. 100% of participants remained stably housed at the end of subsidy.

Summary: The Special Victims Unit (SVU Unit) of the Carroll County State's Attorney's Office addresses the challenges of prosecuting domestic violence (DV) and sexual crimes and working with victims of those crimes. This specialized unit includes three Prosecutors and a Special Victims Unit Advocate who aggressively prosecute domestic violence and sexual assault cases shifting the focus of these crimes from victim responsibility for prosecution to offender accountability. The Unit holds perpetrators of domestic violence and sexual assault accountable through implementation of the pro-prosecution, evidence-based prosecution and victimless prosecution models. Training is another priority of the SVU Unit with training for the unit's three prosecutors in the specialized areas of domestic violence and sexual assault, as well as continued training of law enforcement.

The VAWA grant supports the salary of the DV prosecutor which opened 396 DV cases in 2015. The County provides the match for the VAWA grant by funding the balance of the DV Prosecutor's salary and the benefits, as well as the salary and benefits of the Special Victims Unit Advocate (a county position).

ISSUE:

Amendments to Carroll County Code of Public Local Laws and Ordinances Chapter 36 "Personnel Policies".

BACKGROUND:

On October 6, 2016, staff presented the proposed changes to the Carroll County Code of Public Local Laws and Ordinances Chapter 36 "Personnel Policies". This document as adopted by the Commissioners is to assure the fair and equal treatment of county employees with regard to certain aspects of their employment.

Since the Policy has not been updated since December 2004 the majority of the proposed amendments to Chapter 36 simply clarify and correct obsolete language in the document. However, there are three substantive changes to the document:

- 1. an increase in the amount of compensatory time employees are eligible to maintain,
- 2. the elimination of encumbered leave and advanced sick leave, and
- 3. limiting leave without pay absences to no more than 30 days in a rolling 12 month period.

The Board of Commissioners received a briefing on the nature of the proposed amendments and outline of the reasons for the suggested changes. The purpose of this presentation is to request authorization to proceed to a Public Hearing on the proposed document. The purpose of the hearing is to accept public comment regarding the amendments to Chapter 36 "Personnel Policies".

Request

The Office of Technology Services is requesting your consideration of the award of the maintenance contract for the Carroll County Public Network maintenance contract to Skyline Network Engineering. This maintenance covers all of the edge devices on the county fiber network. The money is in the Fiber Network Operating Budget.

Option 1 – is in the amount of \$67,196 for one year

Details
